

## 5th Sunday of Easter Apríl 28, 2024

Dear Parishioners,

As part of the Eucharistic Revival, Bishop Tylka had a special monstrance commissioned to be used for a holy hour at every parish in the diocese. St. Luke's and St. Joseph's turn is coming up on May 2nd and May 6th respectively. If you've never been to adoration before, it's a privileged time to be before Christ in the Eucharist and enter into a loving dialogue with Him. Some of the most powerful moments of prayer in my life have occurred during adoration.

Adoration is one of the forms of prayer and sacraments by which we remain connected to our Lord. Christ uses the image of a vine and branches to describe why staying united to Him so important. Just as a branch cut off from the vine withers and dies, so does our spirit if cut off from Christ. The branch receives its vital energy and sustenance, its very life, from the branch. Likewise, our souls are vivified, made truly alive, by union with Christ. "Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing."

Remaining with Christ is not a feeling of closeness or even desire. It is an objective fact called the state of grace which begins at baptism and continues so long as we remain free of mortal sin. When we live in grace, Christ is sustaining us with His presence within us, giving us His strength and His Spirit. We may not be aware of it at any given moment, but it is nonetheless very real and has tremendous effects on us. I'm not usually aware of my heart beating, but it is and things would go south very quickly if it weren't.

The state of grace gives us a greater capacity to live as we ought, which in turn opens us up to even greater grace in a never ending positive feedback loop. The only way this process stops is by our choice of sin, which cuts us off from the Lord. Even in this case when we have thrown away God's gifts, we can still seek forgiveness through confession and begin again. Christ's mercy restores us to our union with Him and will continue unless we sin again. "Those who keep his commandments remain in him, and he in them."

We need our Lord's help because His commandments are challenging. like most great accomplishments in life, being good is not easy. In the Acts of the Apostles, the disciples welcome Saul after realizing he is no longer trying to kill them. This man who had persecuted the Church, reviled the name of Christ, and caused the death of their friends becomes a part of the community and even a leader within it. Where did the disciples find the strength to forgive when every human instinct and rationale screamed not to? Through the strength of God dwelling within them. They were branches securely united to the vine and so they could live not as men do but as God does.





### **EUCHARIST ADORATION**
