Changes - While we will not be totally paperless, we will be transitioning to a more web-based and less paper-based way of sharing information. Religious Education - It is exciting that our program is growing. Currently, we have 39 students registered (up from 31 last year)! Each family is asked to sign up twice on the list.

Parishioners who do not have a student in our program this year are also welcome to sign up to help. The formation of our young peoples' faith is very important. The signup sheets are on the table in the foyer.

Adult Class - All are welcome to join the fall classes which will start September 15th following the Sunday 9:00 AM Mass. We will be using DVD series Walking Toward Eternity: Daring To Walk The Walk. This program is to help Catholics live out the faith they profess by cultivating Christian virtue in their daily lives. Walking Toward Eternity is a series of studies designed to help you make real and lasting changes in your life. Through a prayerful reading of Scripture, personal reflection, and a commitment to action, you will grow in faith and be given the means to put it into practice in your daily life. Walking Toward Eternity combines devotional reading of Scripture (lectio divina), personal journaling, group discussion, video commentary, personal witness, and prayer. All of these components serve to illustrate what it means to be a Christian. You will discover how to live out your faith by turning to Scripture and the teachings of the Church, learning practical steps for living a life of holiness and virtue. The DVD series is being purchased through a grant from the diocesan Fulton Sheen Endowment. There will be a charge of \$16 for those wanting the accompanying journal. Light Of Love - We often have ideas of religious life... either kneeling in a convent or out in the streets assisting the poor. While both of these scenes are essential to the life as a sister, Light of Love takes a deeper look into understanding the call... the "why" of religious life. By interviewing five sisters from five orders across the United States, the film places viewers face to face in intimate conversations with these amazing women. What does it mean to be called? What are the struggles of religious life? How have you seen God move through your ministry? These questions and others are addressed throughout the film.

The film itself is very simple: 60 minutes designed for viewers to quiet their surroundings and enter into convent, the food pantry, the hospital, and the chapel. With minimal music and simple visuals, Light of Love gives viewers a look into the lives, suffering, and joys of religious life captured in a way like never before.

The Discussion / Discernment guide that can be downloaded above includes questions that should be considered before pressing play on the film. The film makers recommend viewing the film in one sitting- careful to listen and take in the reality and love of these women.
