After two full weeks, I think I'm finally starting to settle in. Instead, she has a confidence that can only be a gift of the Holy Spirit, "If I but touch his clothes, I shall be cured."

Our past experiences, whether as individuals or a group, do not define our future; the decisions I make this moment and God's grace; Jesus Christ is Lord, and He can cut through decades of baggage in a moment, restoring life, peace, and joy. But only if we trust Him enough to ask. In faith, let us never be afraid to give to our Lord every difficulty and problem, trusting that He will take care of us.
